First Step Shelter, Inc.

First Step Shelter's client experienced homelessness for the first time after being evicted from her rental because she lost her job during her hospital stay due to a heart attack. FSS's Case Manager connected her with vital resources that helped her get back on her feet. The client secured full-time employment and was able to move into an apartment near her workplace. The client's commitment to sobriety and newfound financial and emotional stability significantly reduces the likelihood of her experiencing homelessness again.
